

GATEWAY TO FREDERICK METROPOLITAN DISTRICT NOS. 1-6 2021 CONSOLIDATED ANNUAL REPORT

Pursuant to the Service Plans for the Gateway to Frederick Metropolitan District Nos. 1-6 (collectively, the “Districts”), the Districts are required to provide an annual report to the Town of Frederick (the “Town”) with regard to the following matters:

To the best of our actual knowledge, for the year ending December 31, 2021, the Districts make the following report:

1. A narrative summary of the progress of the Districts in implementing their Service Plans for the report year.

The Districts remained largely inactive during 2021.

2. The Districts were exempt from audit for 2021. Copies of the Audit Exemption Applications from the Colorado State Auditor are attached hereto as **Exhibit A**.

Policy - Requirements

The Office of the State Auditor Local Government Audit Division may accept an electronic submission of an application for exemption from audit that includes governing board signatures obtained through a program such as DocuSign or Echosign. Required elements and safeguards are as follows:
